

Lewisburg Area School District Choice Options for Students



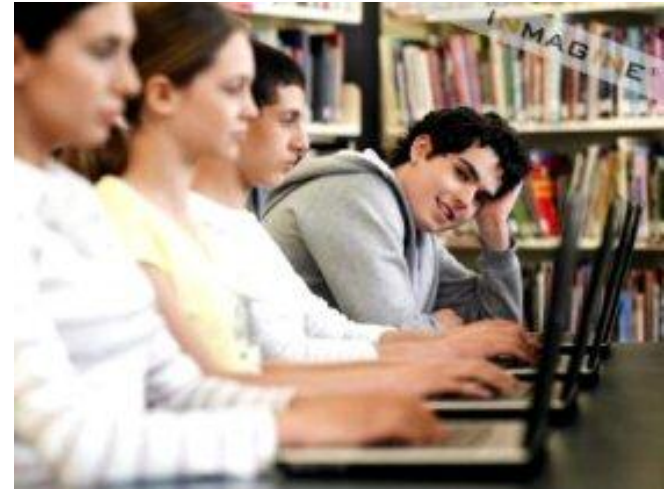
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ACE Program through Bloomsburg University

- College-level courses are taken at Bloomsburg University during the academic year
- Senior-year-at-college programs are also offered for exceptional students, with high school approval
- Provided at 1/3 normal tuition cost

On-Line Courses for High School Students

- Funded by the Green Dragon Foundation
- Students can take on-line courses to augment their schedule through APEX Learning at no cost to the student
- Students can attend APEX for one course, multiple courses, or full-time depending on the circumstances



Cost Comparison Cyber Charter vs. APEX

- Full-Time Cyber Charter Student \$9,865
- Full-Time Special Ed. Cyber Student \$17,704
- Full-Time Apex Learning Student \$5,600

- 34 LASD Students in Cyber \$366,770
- 34 LASD Students in APEX \$190,400
- **Difference** **\$176,370**

Bucknell Courses for High School Students



High school students meeting certain criteria are able to take courses on campus at no cost. Fifty slots are provided annually to Lewisburg Area Students.

Special Home Schooling Options

- Students can follow the Lewisburg Area School District Curriculum with our books and materials
- Home schooling sessions can be for as little as ten school days or for extended trips, etc.

Early College Entrance

- Students may enroll in a two or four year college during their senior year and count their first year college courses toward high school graduation.



Blended Students

- Special consideration can be given to students to complete some of their course work at school and some on-line or through independent study.
- Primary reasons for this option are pregnancy, work, internships, and high level training schedules for music, etc.
