Charlotte Osmolenski is the Associate Director of System Research and Reporting at the central office of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE). Charlotte leads a team who is responsible for providing information that enables the Executive Staff to make decisions; all Federal and State reporting, submission of data for external initiatives (CSRDE, CCA, Net Price Calculator, etc.), and internal and external ad hoc requests. She currently is the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) State Coordinator for PASSHE, responsible for the preparation, accuracy, and submission of the IPEDS surveys on behalf of the 14 state-owned universities and recently became a national IPEDS Trainer, providing education and assistance to users.
