Christine is a graduate of West Chester University. She began her position in the North Penn School District in 1998, after holding various positions in both private companies and educational organizations. She has received numerous awards

for publications, special events and public relations activities from the National School Public Relations Association, the Pennsylvania School Public Relations Association and the Pennsylvania School Business Association. In 2007, she received the Educator 500 award from the 3E Institute of West Chester University, which recognizes entrepreneurial educator who use collaboration, innovation and resourcefulness to bring exciting learning projects to students.
