Dr. Williams is the Assistant to the Superintendent of the Manheim Township School District in Lancaster County. He began his career as a middle school English and Social Studies teacher in the Penn Manor School District, spending several years as a middle school team leader. He was elected teacher union president of the Penn Manor Education Association in his late twenties and led the Association through a tumultuous contract negotiations, narrowly averting a teacher strike. He eventually transitioned into the role of technology coordinator, establishing Penn Manor's information technology department.

In 1999, Williams became the Director of Information Technology at Manheim Township. During that tenure he earned his master's and doctorate degrees, after which he transitioned back into the instructional world as the Director of Instruction in 2009.
