Dr. Stennett is the Director of the Ed. D program and is an assistant professor in the Education Department at Point Park University. He teaches at all levels in the department and has been working at Point Park for over ten years.

The Pennsylvania Association of Elementary and Secondary School Principals recently named Eric W. Stennett, Ed. D., assistant professor in the Education Department at Point Park University, the 2013 Middle School Level Principal of the Year.

Dr. Stennett is the former principal of Hampton Middle School in Allison Park, Pa. As principal, he enhanced the school's bullying prevention program and integrated technology across all content areas through the integration of STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math) strategies.

In addition, Stennett has helped develop the school principal certificate program at Point Park University and Carnegie Mellon University and teaches education graduate courses in leadership and instructional supervision. He also serves on the undergraduate and graduate advisory councils at Point Park University. He taught Life and Earth Science and majored in Geology and Earth Science during his time as an undergraduate student. Stennett earned his bachelor's degree from Wittenberg University, his master's degree from Wright State University and his doctoral degree from Nova Southeastern University. He also served in the U.S. Army Reserves from 1988 to 2003.
